In regards to the Bauple RV site in my observation it represents a glorified car park, as the amenities are at some distance from the area as well as having inadequate signage to their location.

I feel that the Rossendale Park is more suited, but there again it has no amenities, therefore bad hygiene practices occur in the bushland surrounding the park having toilet paper visibly blowing around the area.

The other option is the Tiaro RV site as it has Shops, Pub, Fuel as well as suitable toilets and showers, Bauple needs to follow Tiaro's example and follow suit. Tiaro's Sons

This month's salute to the Diggers is to:

Leonard Howard NEILSEN

AIF Regimental No 20850

Leonard was born, we believe, in Gundiah and had an occupation of labourer when he decided to enlist in the Army at the age of 21 years and 10 months. He enlisted on the 15th November 1915 in the 9th Field Artillery Brigade 33rd Battery and given the rank of Gunner. After training he embarked from Sydney on board HMAT A8 Argyllshire, 11th May 1916. He landed in Devonport on 10th July 1916 and then to the battle fields in France on the 6th Jan 1917. Leonard was killed in Action in Belgium on the 25th September 1917 and is buried in The Huts Cemetery Dickebusch Belguim. His awards were the British War Medal, Victory Medal, Memorial Plaque and Scroll. Leonard's parents were D and Rachel Neilsen of Mountain View, Gundiah, Old. LEST WE FORGET

Great War Statistics

Each month in this year we will look at snippets from the Great War history books:



Enlisted Men. In August 1914 Great Britain, its Empire and Commonwealth had almost one million soldiers. At the end of the war in November 1918 it had enlisted almost 6 million.

HMAS Sydney trophy Local Gundiah resident, Mark Nixon-

Local Gundiah resident, Mark Nixon-Smith (*Nikko is pictured below*), comes from a long line of Navy and shipping professionals. His great uncle Fife Nixon-Smith married the daughter of the captain of HMAS *Sydney*.

In their personal memorabilia, Nikko has the last shell taken out of the breach of the German battleship SMS *Emden* after she was destroyed, and surrendered to the HMAS *Sydney* near the Cocos Islands, November 1914.



Down Memory Lane The Waldock Family

as told by Joy Edmunds of Tiaro My Dad's grandfather William Marriot Waldock of Tetworth, Huntingdonshire, England, married Francis Roberts and emigrated to Australia in 1853. (I am not sure if they came straight to Tiaro.) They had 9 children–I know some of them were born on the Mary River and that 2 of them were amongst the first pupils to attend the first public school to open in Tiaro in 1871.

Blacksmiths. Dad always said his grandfather and father were blacksmiths and they settled beside where the United Church was built in 1885. It was where my son Philip had a house built before his marriage, he has since moved. Dad used to talk about his boyhood in Tiaro as you can imagine he had lots of uncles, aunts and cousins as there were 9 children–5 boys and 4 girls! His father would not let them go to school unless they had pulled a dozen weeds out of the vegetable garden.

When Philip had his house built they discovered a large concreted hole in the ground, they said it was where the buggy and sulky rims went into a fire as part of the process to expand the steel rim to fit it over the timber wheel. Then when he started to make gardens he found enough horse shoes to fill the concreted hole to the top, I live down the hill a bit from there and I am still finding them in my garden.

Last Aboriginals. Dad always talked about the stables they had for the three horses, where the last of the aboriginals lived (two men & one woman). In those days they said the river had lots of small sharks. When the boys caught sharks they would bring them home for the aboriginals who also fed them to the possums. They (the aboriginals) always had fires going and would throw the possums into the fire, fur and all.

Further afield. I don't know when the Waldocks left Tiaro, but I think it was before the First World War because I think two of dad's younger brothers went to war from Kilkivian. Dad must have moved to Bauple long before, because he had built a house, married and had two young daughters.

Melkshoms. He married my mother, Maude Melkshom, whose father had a boarding house across the road from where Jim Bates' sawmill once was. Mums dad, Albert Melkshom, was a Engineer in the Bauple Sugar Mill and he must have helped dad get his papers to become an engineer also. Dad was able to become the chief Engineer until it closed.

Dad told me about Mum's Mother who had a baby boy in Bauple. I don't know if he was born dead or died after. Granddad went and built a coffin to put the baby in, got on his horse with the coffin in front of him rode into the Tiaro cemetery, dug the grave and buried him. Things were hard in those days.

Mt Urah tennis courts were built in 1950. The catalyst was the destruction of Emery's Bridge by a flash flood in October 1949. This isolated the residents of the Mt Urah district until the new bridge (that's the old bridge now) was opened on 21st July 1951. Social tennis had been played at Jack and Bella Thompson's property, 'Rocklea', until 1940 when they shifted to 'Pine View'.

There was a court there but the social dislocation caused by the war meant not much sport of any kind was played until the mid to late 40's.

After the war people just wanted to get on with life and when they couldn't travel anywhere to play tennis or have any outside social life, this self reliant community built a tennis court on the wide road reserve near Hibbet's property. Winter was for playing tennis as the dairy cows were dried off, so every Sunday the whites and sandshoes came out, the billy was boiled, sandwiches were shared and some tennis balls had the fluff knocked off them.

This soon expanded to three courts as

travel got easier and nearly everyone played tennis. The club joined in competition with others around the Tiaro Shire and it was a hugely successful means of bringing all the small communities together in a fiercely competitive but very social and friendly way.

Tennis was an easy way for socialising as it was not expensive and creating a court was fairly simple. All it needed was willing hands to level a bit of ground and cart antbed to make a smooth hard surface.

The club finally faded away by about 1990 as it succumbed to a changing world and pretty much just ran out of people. The slab shed, which was quite an icon, was built of slabs from the original house of the Jessen family who were amongst the first freehold settlers in what was then known as the Goora district. It was destroyed by a bushfire four years ago.

In our district we are very fortunate to still have the Rossendale Tennis Club, as a link to a past era and community.

POLICE TALK Are your water supplies secure?

As we are again going through a particularly dry stretch it might be timely to reconsider the security of one of your most valuable possessions ... water.

Water theft has been and will continue to be an issue in rural communities. To help prevent this:

•Secure your water tank by installing an anti-theft tap or removing the tap handle

Install a'hitch lock'locking mechanism
Tell a trusted neighbour if you are expecting a water delivery. After the tanker leaves ask them to check to the tank level.

•Report anything unusual – eg an unscheduled visit of a water tanker to your neighbour's property.

More RVs and truck parking for Tiaro

Tiaro businesses should benefit from two new stopping bays built for drivers of long vehicles to pull over for a rest. The bays are in Inman Street for drivers heading south and on Mayne Street for Drivers heading north."The bays are sign posted," Division Four Councillor Phil Truscott said."They will accommodate two RVs or trucks.

"The idea is to attract more trucks and RVs to pull over, stop and have a cup of coffee while the drivers stretch their legs."The idea for the long-vehicle bays was put forward by Cr Truscott."I floated the idea with residents during my regular community chats and progress association meetings,"he said. The work was undertaken and funded by Council. "While it is only a small idea, it is one of the many examples of Council working to improve the region's economy," he said."It will take about four weeks to complete, weather permitting." *FCRC*

AE Fielding Park Upgrade

Pathways and bollards will be installed in AE Fielding Park, Mungar, west of Maryborough as part of a project due to start on August 18."The \$24,000 project should take three weeks, weather permitting,"Sport, Recreation, Open Space and Events Portfolio Councillor Darren Everard said. The work includes bollards to restrict vehicles driving around the amenities block to stop further damage to existing paths and improve safety for children within the park. The guttering on the amenities block will be replaced and awnings installed over the entranc-



es to the toilet to stop rain entering and making the floors slippery.Concrete pathways will be installed to replace pavers to ensure the facility complies with Disabled Access guidelines. The existing timber picnic tables will be replaced with aluminium tables and benches on concrete slabs."Some of the work will have an added benefit of reducing maintenance costs," Divisional Councillor James Hansen said. *FCRC*

25 August 2014 New hope for the embattled Tinana koala population emerged today, as Federal Member for Wide Bay and Deputy Prime Minister Warren Truss, called upon the community to assist in efforts to save koala habitat at Tinana.

"A \$200,000 crowd-sourced fundraising campaign has been launched to purchase koala habitat in the Henderson Park estate," Mr Truss said.

"Three uncleared allotments in the estate will be quarantined from future development and held by the Fraser Coast Regional Council as an environmental reserve, if we are able to raise the funds to secure them,"Mr Truss said.

"The developer has made the land available and the Council has agreed to maintain and manage the site."

Mr Truss said it is now up to us to demonstrate our care and appreciation for these very precious animals and support efforts to save their habitat.

Tax deductible donations to purchase the land can be made through the Queensland Trust for Nature.
