Tiaro Bypass miles away

The Queensland and Federal Labor Governments have finally confirmed that the much-needed four lane Tiaro bypass will not be prioritised until at least 2026-27 or beyond.

"The latest funding profile Indicates the timing for completion of this new, vital nine kilometre corridor has already slipped out by at least a year," Mr O'Brien said.

"The Australian Government report confirms that more than half of the Australian Government's \$268.8 million contribution to the project's total \$336 million budget will not be spent and our community's campaign to get this bypass done as soon as possible is being ignored by State and Federal Labor Governments." - Llew O'Brien
