New Surgery at Bauple

Residents in the old Tiaro Shire are excited to have another option for medical services this month.

An unusual move by Dr Suzy Baudouef sees her open a new surgery in spite of the impending opening of the longawaited Tiaro Medical Centre.

"We have had to set up quickly, but are very pleased with our progress to date. The landlord has been very helpful. All services are not in place but we are confident that we can be up and running quickly. We plan to be a fully accredited practice in a year," said the doctor.

The new "Bopple Surgery" (named from an original spelling of Bauple,) will bulk bill, includes two staff nurses that will eventually offer senior health assessments, antenatal and postnatal care, pre-school health check-ups, vaccination clinic, and Indigenous health checks, diabetic and asthma clinics.

The new office is conveniently located in the white house opposite Bauple Museum with adequate parking and wheelchair access.

"This move allows me to give patients the care and attention I want and supports the current need for more local services, assuming the Tiaro Medical Centre will be adequately staffed when it opens,"Dr Baudeouf explained. With the opening of the Tiaro Medical Centre promised at the end of the September, the Monsour Clinic's office at Tiaro is currently closed until refurbishments are complete.

Cr Linda Harris said, "The Fraser Coast Regional Council called for expressions of interest for the provision of medical services at the new Tiaro Medical Centre. These closed on 9th August, 2011 and are currently being assessed by Council staff. It is anticipated that a confidential report will go to Council in early September for consideration. All tenders and expressions of interest are handled confidentially because of their commercially confidential information." Trevor Keightley of Gundiah said,"It is a shame that both our most popular doctor and our new chemist are not in the Tiaro Medical Centre. We have been waiting so long, with so much anticipation. Hopefully it will not turn out to be a white elephant. The Council, unfortunately, is to blame for this, had they acted more promptly, this would never have happened."

Private Roy Gee



Private Roy Gee was the second son of Mr. and Mrs. W Gee of Bauple. Born on 7th April, 1917, he attended Bauple State school and enlisted in the Army in 1944 aged 27.

Roy answered his country's call in its hour of need, taking into the Army those sterling qualities which made him and his type, 'men' in the real sense of the word. Roy was posted to the 129 General Transport Company and died from an illness whilst in New Guinea on 26th Aug 1944. He was buried in Buna and then was moved to Pt. Moresby.

Roy was a well-known Maryborough Sportsman and was particularly well known in the Tennis fraternity. He was a thorough gentleman on and off the court. He was one of the finest players produced in Maryborough and fans of the day would remember him best for his flashes of brilliance on the court. Roy held the Kaminski and Stanley Byrne Memorial cups. Among his notable successes were winning the Open Singles Championships at Bundaberg and Kingaroy. Lest we forget.

Down Memory Lane A forgotten Boat Shed

Has anyone ever wondered what the old slab shed under the Crow's Ash tree on the western bank of the Mary River is there for?

For almost one hundred years, this shed housed each of the ferry boats used by those who lived in the Mt Urah district on the western side of the river.

Because of the new high level bridge and modern transport, such as helicopters used in emergencies, the Emerys Bridge Boat Committee has been disbanded, but the shed was left in it's present position for historical purposes. The shed's last resident boat is sadly now rotted away after being attacked by white ants during the long droughts of the late 1980's when it's services were not needed.

It was purchased by the residents of this area in the late 1950's to replace a boat destroyed by a flash flood.

Built by Barney Meyers and designed for running water, it had provision for two oarsmen but only one was ever needed. That one man could safely row two people and 80 gallons of cream across the Mary on a 10 or 12 metre flood is a testament to the craftsmanship of Barney Meyers.

Since the beginning of the last century, there has been a ferry boat housed in that shed.

The boat was used often during the wet seasons to transport cream, milk and produce over the river and bring supplies and mail back. During floods residents would gather twice a week to "put the boat in". There were some strange loads at times. If it would fit in the boat it came over. Dogs, stud pigs and machinery parts were common fare as was the occasional medical emergency. It also bore witness to the sadder side of life with more than one coffin being carried in and then returned bearing a

sombre load.

Primary school children received their school lessons by boat when the river was in flood. High schoolers would be transported across the river on a Sunday afternoon, taken to Maryborough where they stayed for the week and then returned home on Friday afternoons to have the weekends at home.

The late Mr George James and the late Mr Joe Wade were the early residents who rowed the boat across the flooded river. Mr Wade then taught his grandson, Vivian Sleaford, the art of rowing in flooded streams and at the age of fifteen, Vivian took over as the one the residents depended on to get them across the river, many times in emergency situations.

Others who helped out with the oars were Brian Lamke and Fred Dawes and the late Mr Dunbar Lawson. In later years an outboard motor with Brian Lamke at the helm was used instead of oars. When the boat was no longer river worthy, Vivian Sleaford used his own boat and motor. *Owen Thompson*

Tiaro Memorial Restoration

Council received 50% funding from the Community Memorials Restoration Program to undertake some remedial works at the War Memorial in Tiaro. These works have included, repairs to the base of the war memorial, installation of a new flagpole, new concrete pad to house the donated gun and upgrades to the gardens on this site. The War Memorial site also contains two Torelliana Trees that Council plan to remove. Council's Supervisor of Parks Works has inspected these trees and provided a Tree Hazard Evaluation. As a result of this inspection, both of these trees have been recommended for removal. It is proposed to replant more suitable species in these locations.

Highway News

Late July saw consultation in Tiaro organised by Department of Transport and Main Roads, regarding "Bruce Highway Pavement reconstruction" for two kilometres through the township of Tiaro. Two intersections will be upgraded to include dedicated right turn lanes. These are the Bruce Highway, Mungar Road and John Street and the Bruce Highway and Jacobsen Street. Construction will be progressive and at times traffic diversions will be put in place"
