Gundiah Community benefits from Helping Hands

Helpers from the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints get together with Gundiah to fix up and clean up their local hall.

Helpers outnumbered locals and were aged from 8 to 70-something as they worked to possum-proof eaves, replace floorboards, mend benches, neaten the garden and clean hall walls, kitchen cupboards and storerooms.

David Carney, recently elected president of the Gundiah Hall said the help was much appreciated as the old hall is in need of much fixing."We have only a small group of members so far, and we really appreciate the extra man hours to get things moving."

The Gundiah Hall was built in 1922 and celebrates its 90th birthday in November this year. It has had a few years of neglect, a condition the newly formed committee wishes to rectify. They have quite a job ahead of them but are starting with repainting the interior after recent record flooding warranted insurance payments to the fact. The working bee by locals and the church group was the first step in achieving this end. The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter -Day Saints participates in 'community service' projects on a semi-annual basis and was only too pleased to have this project suggested to them. Church members came from the greater Gympie area and brought tools and offered lots of elbow-grease to get the jobs done. "It is great to offer our skills and manpower in a situation like this," said Bishop Brett Woolley."It is great experience for our families and being able to achieve something good on top of that for the Gundiah Hall is the bonus." Handy Hire in Maryborough donated the painters trestles free of charge.

The Gundiah Hall Secretary said, "It was good to feel that someone else cares about our little hall besides us. It is good to see the community spirit increase in our local community too. We have some good eggs around here who are always willing to lend a hand." SGK

Myles Stratford Long 1936-2012.



On Saturday 8th September saw the passing of a local legend known by all in the past Tiaro Shire.

Myles was 75. He was born 21st September 1936 and raised on the family farm at Chatsworth, attending the local school till year 7. At age 14 he started his working life as a bean picker on Keith Allen's farm, then moved to his sister Betty's farm at Mulgeldie near Monto to work in the local Saw Mill. He then took on a new job at Cooroy Saw Mill for a few years, returning to Chatsworth to work on the family farm with his brother Harry.

He met Marion at a local dance in 1958 and they were married on 28th March 1959. For a couple of years they managed a farm at Chatsworth owned by Marion's parents, later buying the farm at Bauple/Gootchie where they have lived for the past 48 years. For many years they grew a variety of small crops and employed people to pick at harvest time.

Myles was an active member in a number of local organizations: from 1985 till

2008 was a councilor in the Tiaro Shire until amalgamation and in 2004 he became deputy mayor.

Mr Long was an active board member of Gunalda Fruit & Vegetable Growers Association, was also Glenwood Progress Association chairman and Bauple Band Hall secretary for five terms.

Myles had been an active supporter of the Gundiah Rural Fire Brigade & Fire Warden since 2010. He was Chairman of the Brigade from 1997-2009 (12yrs) & Vice President from 1995-1997.

Beside all their achievements Myles and Marion also established the Service Station and Store at Glenwood, until they sold the business in 2009 and retired at the age of 73.

Myles leaves behind his wife Marion and their four children–Gary, David, and twins Sally & Wendy, their partners, seven grandchildren & three great grandchildren who will all miss him dearly. Rest in Peace Myles.

Strong future for Rural Firies

The Minister for Police and Community Safety Jack Dempsey announced that the Newman Government and the Rural Fire Brigades Association of Queensland (RFBAQ) have agreed on initiatives to ensure rural volunteer firefighters are empowered and equipped to protect their communities into the future.

"Under the agreed new model, there will be no closure of any Rural Fire Service (RFS) area offices," Mr Dempsey said.

"Unfortunately as a part of this process, there will be a reduction in the number of full time equivalent positions, but this will be limited to executive and administration areas, and will not take place until after the fire season in March 2013." Mr Dempsey asked that the review of the RFS be completed by February 2013.

"The RFBAQ and Minister for Police and Community Safety are both united in maintaining all Rural Operations Area Offices across Queensland," Mr Garrahy said. "This allows Rural Fire Brigades to have support and certainty going into the worst bushfire season in more than 40 years."

Mr Garrahy said that an earlier proposal to close Area Offices in areas such as Maryborough would not go ahead.

"The RFBAQ believes that this puts Rural Fire Brigades on track for achieving a model that empowers Brigades to defend their communities not only from fire, but also from flood and cyclone."

Herbert Arthur Snell

Qx21253 PRIVATE – AUSTRALIAN ARMY Herbert (known as Arthur) was born 31st March 1919 to Charles and Ethel Snell at Wooroolin, South Burnett. Arthur and his 6 brothers and sisters–Viv, Frank, June, Les, Muriel and Trea– had a happy hard working childhood on their farm. He attended the Kenilworth State School and later played cricket for the local team, worked at Kenilworth Sawmill and other farms in the district.

Arthur enlisted in the Army at Gympie on 20th May 1941 at age 22 and was drafted to Singapore. He was taken prisoner at the prisoner-of-war camp at Moulmein Burma with his friend McGhie. He was being transferred on the prison ship Rakuyo Maru with 1300 prisoners to Japan for labour work, when it was sunk by an American Submarine on the 13th September 1944 and many of the prisoners were drowned including Arthur.
